## Centennial Concert Series Presents: *Hendersonville Children's Choir*

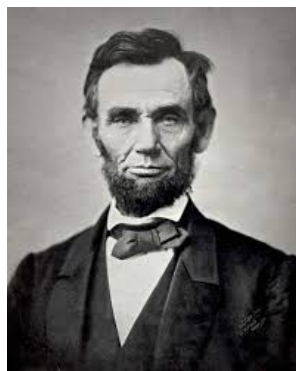

## Abraham Lincoln Comes to Henderson County

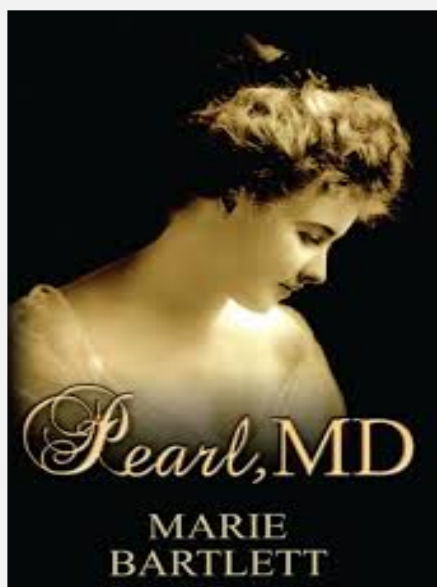

**Fletcher, Saturday March 15, 10:00—11:00am** this program will be suited for all ages.

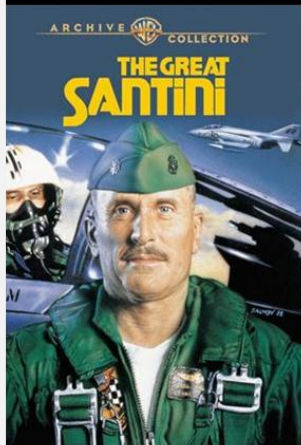


## Local author Marie Bartlett at Fletcher Branch

Knitting Group meets each Tuesday afternoon, 1:30 – 3:00 p.m. Come join the fun. These ladies have a great time!

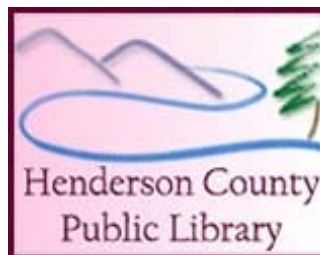

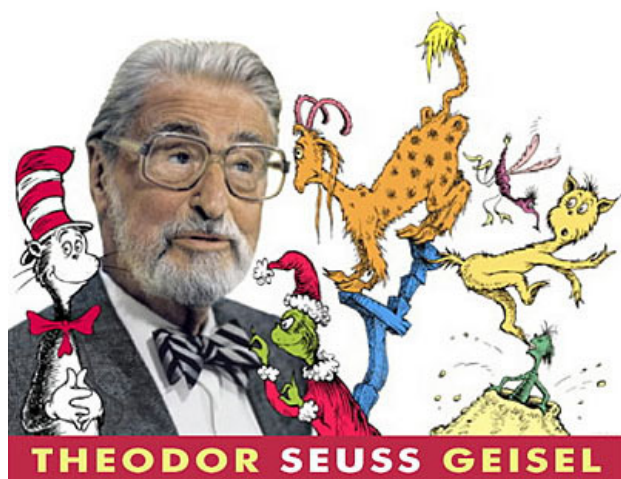

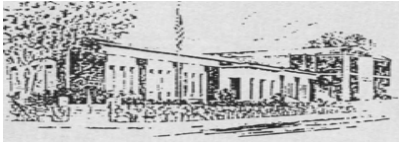
